WHEN THE STRANGE LAND BECOMES GRACE LAND

"By the Rivers of Babylon, our captors required of us a song. How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?" (Psalm 137)

The other day I opened my Spotify app and searched again for that familiar song from my younger years. The song was called "Babylon." It was recorded by the Reggae Band named Boney M. It was their very catchy musical rendition of Psalm 137, and it was always a super-fun "easy listening". Today, however, I find myself relating to that song much differently than I did as a naive teenager. Today I can hear, all too clearly, those sad sounds of God's people, weeping, as they sit by the rivers of Babylon; prisoners and captives of a powerful conqueror, but also captives of a fearful and vindictive spirit. Sadly, recent political events have shown how that malignant spirit continues to

stalk our world; still determined to take us hostage to anger, mistrust and resentments. It's a spirit eager to attack us with suspicions and doubts, and even more eager to turn ourselves, and nations, and peoples, into fear-filled strangers. What can we do?

As captives in a strange land, God's people knew there was only one answer. They knew that they must not lose their voice. They knew they must keep on singing, because to sing meant life. They knew that, even in captivity, to refuse to sing was to die. And so they sang. They sang despite their suffering. They sang in hope. Eventually, their music became faith.

Then, became prayer. Then, became perseverance. Then, became victory. In due season, the spirit that would have enslaved all was defeated, and God's people won a freedom even their captors came to respect. If we are to overcome the enslaving spirit still trying to take our world hostage today, then we too must never let our song be silenced. As it was for God's people of old, so it must be for us. To sing means life. To be silent is to remain in prison. To be silent is to be without hope.

And so we sing. Sometimes out loud and with others. Sometimes quietly. Sometimes even alone, but always singing to summon that other, greater, more powerful Spirit. Whose love is our Bridge Over Troubled Waters. Whose joy is The Wind Beneath Our Wings. We sing - knowing that our singing is as necessary as air and breath. We sing because, somehow, we understand: God will use our singing to help heal the world.


And so we sing. Even when we would rather weep. We sing in the dark as well as in the light, through certainty and doubt, in sunshine and in rain, and even when we are afraid. We sing because, somehow, we understand: the world still looks to people of faith to give to them a song, and a reason, to fight against the silence. To hope.

And so we sing. Wherever we are. Just as we are. Though tossed about. With many a conflict. Many a doubt. Fightings and Fears. Within. Without. O Lamb of God, we sing! We sing! Until that glorious day when our world, and strangers, are strangers no longer; until our Strange land becomes Grace Land, let us sing!



Foundational Learners Assistance Eligibility

Alberta Community and Social Services is committed to ensuring that supports are available to assist learners in completing their high school education. Therefore, Prospect Human Services is contracted to provide Assessment and Case Management services for 16 – 20 year old learners seeking financial supports to attend public high school.

The Prospect Human Service's website is www.ProspectNow.ca which can help with a bit of information on Prospect Human Services including our mission, supporters, programs, and much more! The Youth Assessment Centre (YAC), a division of Prospect who works with the Foundational Learners Assistance Program, does not have a link on the site. This is because our division and funding is accessed through referrals from people like you and is not recommended to the general public.

We run strictly off of the GOA policies based on Foundational Learners Assistance Funding, aimed towards students aged 16-20 in K-12 education programs, who demonstrate financial need and whether or not they meet the following criteria:

- i) Pregnant or is the parent of a child, or
- ii) Married, have a common-law partner or is widowed, separated, or divorced, or
- iil) There is a breakdown in relationship with the learner's guardian(s) or unsafe living conditions

The student must be registered "Full Time" at an approved educational facility. "Full Time" is defined as being registered and participating in a minimum of 3 classes per semester.

Alberta Works funded learners are expected to attend the program, make acceptable progress, achieve their training goal and facilitate a successful transition to further education or employment. Funding is based on participation/ progression in the classes and consultations with the student as well as the school.

In order to Apply for Foundational Learners Assistance students will need to obtain:

- Their Social Insurance Number
- My Alberta Digital ID https://account.alberta.ca/(this is where they can create an account if they do not already have one)
 - After creating an account the government will send verification via text or in the mail (takes 5-10 days)
 - If they do not have the documents required to obtain a MADI, we can work on an Alternate ID Verification process with them
- Banking Information no form anymore but we do need the Transit, Routing, and Account Number

There are 3 different "Branches" to the Application process: the MADI, the email link from Foundational Learners Assistance, and the Assessment completed by our Coordinators.

Once all 3 have been completed/received, we can start the Application.
