Dear Parents and Guardians of Dr. Folkins Community School,

Welcome to another exciting year of learning! We hope you and your family are enjoying the end of summer and are looking forward to welcoming everyone back into our building.

We would like to inform you of an important update regarding our school's policy on personal electronic devices. This new policy, which aligns with a recent Ministerial Order from the Alberta government, is set to take effect on September 1, 2024. The aim of these new regulations is to enhance our students' learning experience by reducing distractions and fostering a more focused classroom environment.

Here's a summary of the key changes:

- Social media will be blocked on all school Wi-Fi and devices.
- Personal electronic devices, including cell phones, tablets, laptops, Chromebooks, Smartwatches, headphones, and gaming devices, will be restricted during instructional time.
- Devices required for medical reasons should be discussed with school administration.

For Grades K-6 at Dr. Folkins Community School:

- The best practice is to avoid bringing personal electronic devices to school.
- If devices are brought, they must be turned off and stored in a bin within the classroom or locker throughout the school day.

For Junior/Senior High at Dr. Folkins Community School:

- As a best practice, students should also avoid bringing electronic devices to school.
- If devices are brought, they must be turned off and not accessible during instructional time. Phones should not be accessed in the hallways or the bathroom at this time.
- Students are encouraged to use their lockers for storage; a combination lock is recommended to secure their devices.

If a student uses their device during class, there will be a series of steps to address this. On the first occurrence, the device will be taken by the teacher and returned at the end of the class with a gentle reminder of our policy. For a second occurrence, the device will be handed to the principal and returned to the student at the end of the school day. If it happens a third time, we'll need to contact parents, and the device will again be returned at the end of the day. For any further instances, a meeting with the principal and parents will be necessary before the device is returned, and additional disciplinary actions may apply according to our school's discipline policy. Our goal is to keep everyone focused on learning while still respecting personal boundaries.

We understand that these changes may require some adjustment, and we encourage you to discuss the new policy with your child to help them understand and adapt to these changes. We also want to assure you that students will have access to school phones for any necessary communication. If you need to leave a message for your child, please call the school. If you have any questions or need further clarification, please do not hesitate to contact the school office, or see the BTPS administrative procedure 303.1AP at www.btps.ca/download/466239. We appreciate your support in helping us create a productive and respectful learning environment for all students.

Government of Alberta announcement:
"To safeguard student mental health and reduce distractions, personal mobile devices will no longer be permitted during class time and access to social media sites will be restricted." Effective September 1, 2024.

Take proactive steps to help your family prepare for the new device-free policy.

- Learn about the new policy and implementation plan in your child's school; and talk with your children to prepare.
- Convey a positive attitude about the change and focus on the benefits.
- Brainstorm ways to communicate during school time when needed and create the habit of planning.

Focus on the benefits of device-free classrooms.

Students learn better without phones.

Research shows that when phones

- are away, test scores increase.
- are present, students who are already struggling, struggle more.

Students have improved mood and mental health without phones. Benefits include:

- Increased self-control and ability to focus.
- Improved ability to self-regulate.
- Reduced symptoms of depression and anxiety.
- More in-person time with friends, peers and mentors helps improve their mood.

Tips for device-free success:

- Although students may still have access to their phones on their breaks, create the habit of planning each day without text messages or phone call reminders. Plan ahead for pickup times/locations, appointments or other activities. This will instill responsibility and help them develop valuable executive-functioning skills.
- Help your children memorize your phone number and other emergency numbers. If they need to reach you while they are at school, they can call from the school office or ask their teacher for assistance.
- Call the school office if you need to relay a message to your child vs texting or calling their device.

Tips to encourage healthy cell phone and device habits:

- Set aside devices during mealtimes and focus on conversations.
- Make common areas where family and friends hang out together, device-free to promote positive interactions.
- Put away your own devices when your children are around and want to interact with you. Give them your full attention – they will appreciate you for it, and you will set a great example.
- Encourage everyone to put their devices away at least an hour before bedtime and keep them out of the bedrooms.

BRITE Program

September 2024



I think we can all agree that summer flew by, but I sure am glad to be back to work with all of the amazing students in our school! The BRITE (Building Resilient Individuals Through Empowerment) Program was funded for another full year at Dr. Folkins Community School and Provost Public School. For those that are unfamiliar with BRITE, we are mental health and wellness facilitators within classrooms. This looks like presentations, activities, discussions, games, and programs surrounding topics within mental health and wellness. We are universal supporters which means we do group/class sessions. Staff are based in each school (Provost, Chauvin, Edgerton, Hughendon, and Amisk) and partnering with local community services offering programming surrounding mental health and wellness for students in Kindergarten to Grade 12, as well as the staff in our schools. We hope to inspire, intrigue and empower students, teachers, families and communities.

Programming will kick off in classrooms in October with topics around how words matter. This program targets all ages, teaching students the influence their words have on others, how others perceive them, and why it is important to choose what we say wisely, which we all often forget. Younger grades will kick off with Little Spot, a series of books and activities about a little spot who teaches students about different emotions, such as why we feel certain ones, how to know which emotion we are feeling, and how to tell what others may be feeling as well.

I am extremely excited and grateful to be back for another year! I look forward to building relationships with our amazing students!

NO SMART-PHONES AT HOGWARTS ACADEMY!

AND SO IT BEGINS!

A NEW AND EXCITING SCHOOL YEAR! NEW FRIENDS! NEW OPPORTUNITIES!

AND ALONG WITH EVERYTHING ELSE, NEW EXPECTATIONS AND NEW CHALLENGES AS WELL!

For any young child experiencing butterflies in their tummy at starting school for the very first time, this has been the usual course of events – matched only by those butterflies in our own hearts as we watched our children take that momentous first step into the world beyond the home. Immediately, we started to remember our own first days; those first classes, those first lessons, the first awkward hello's to those who, eventually, became either our closest friends or our school-yard rivals, etc...! As we watched our children prepare for school, we remembered the magic, and we sent our children with the hope that they too would soon find, and make, magical memories of their own.

And speaking of magic, perhaps no one has explored that deep connection between “magic” and “learning” better than author and writer J.K. Rowling in her adventure stories centered around a fictional school called Hogwarts Academy. Once you open the first Book in the series, you'll see how J.K. Rowling's characters show us, in a winsome, exciting, and challenging way, how learning is itself the best form of magic; how incredible and amazing things can happen when real learning is promoted and fostered. For students at Hogwarts, in fact, the magic was first encountered not only in their teachers but at the Academy itself. The atmosphere, even the buildings at Hogwarts, were imbued with magical properties. The teachers, many of them very human, even humorous in their sometimes bumbling efforts to make the magic happen, nevertheless embodied the magic of that place. They knew what they had to do, and they knew their mission - to offer every imaginable and conceivable means to pass on the magic of real learning, and to do so with the help of an entire institution very much “alive:” with magical properties!

At Hogwarts the Magic was also in the lessons – all purposely designed to avoid any political agenda, and instead to help students discover the real, the true magic that already existed deep in their souls, and hearts, and spirits. Lessons designed to honour and to enhance the gifts that the mysterious divine consciousness had already given them.

And best of all, at Hogwarts the magic also happened in the ebb and flow of human relationships, both the good and the not so good. At Hogwarts, students learned to make friends with others by first making friends with themselves; with their own imaginations, with their own capacity for love, kindness, compassion and courage, and then to discover, and delight in their highest self, their best aspirations,

Students at Hogwarts also learned the importance of acknowledging the existence of their shadow-side, and to learn that “other” real magic – humility, courage, and self-control. They learned they too had a mission – to help the world discover the “magic” that upholds and supports everything...! They learned that not only Hogwarts, but the whole world was full of real and true and lasting magic – all just waiting to be learned and embraced.

By the way: There were no smart-phones at Hogwarts Academy. Such quasi-magical devices would have been what they actually are in the schools our children attend - impediments to the real magic that happens when young minds are first invited to encounter knowledge and wisdom.

There were no smart-phones at Hogwarts Academy. Wouldn't it be wonderful if the same were true at every other basic institution of learning as well..!
