Hello everyone, and welcome to another edition of Career Corner.

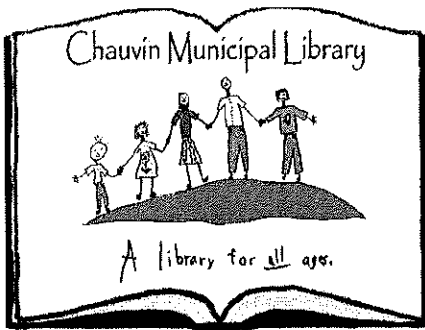

(ARE YOU) SHARING YOUR MORNING LIGHT?

ON THE MORNING OF SUNDAY December 22nd, 2024, at precisely 2:22AM, an event occurred which people everywhere anticipated with great joy. That morning, the sun rose in the sky exactly one minute earlier than the day previous – thus beginning a process that would eventually bring us over 3 extra minutes of sunlight each day and would not reach its zenith until the 21st day of June!

I love the winter solstice! I look forward to each and every occurrence and, apparently, so did the Roman Emperor Constantine. Constantine was a convert to Christianity, and one of his first acts as a Christian Emperor was to decree that the birth of Jesus would henceforth be celebrated on that special day in December when the darkness would begin to ebb and the light would wax brighter and brighter. Today, some two thousand years later, we make the same metaphorical connection, and honour that same tradition - celebrating the birth of the

Son of God on a day nearest to the rebirth of the sun in the sky!

This month we begin the Season of Epiphany. It's the Season when we are invited to remember that as Christians, we possess a light NOT dependent upon the calendar, but which continuously shines brightly regardless of the season – an inner light which shines in our hearts and can never be extinguished. It's the light which God gives to all who believe in His Son, and it brings a new dawn to our hearts, our lives, and our hopes.

It's the light that makes us, and helps us to become, God's own "Morning People."

So. How about you? Has your faith made you a "morning person" today? Has your faith made you a person who shares your special morning light with others? Are you ready to offer your world the light of love and compassion – the light that creates a new, brighter and better morning for anyone whose life is filled with darkness, or grief, or emptiness?

The world needs people like that. The world will always need people who are willing and able to offer even just a little light to someone in need - even when we ourselves are all too aware of our own darkness and shadows, and even when we too, struggle to find the light. Not only to others, but also to us God says: "Fear not! Go, and help another to be a little more at peace, to have a little more courage, a little more hope, or find a little more grace! Go and share the light I have given you. Go, and let others know about that Dawn which breaks the deepest darkness!" Whenever we help another find even just a little joy, or to sing, or to laugh, or to pray, or to find truth, or courage, or forgiveness – that's when we'll know that we are truly "Morning People" in the best sense.

So let's wake up! Let's be ready! God knows, in this world it's not enough to have a New Morning only when the sun rises in the sky, or only when another day on the Calendar begins. God knows, and so do we, there will always be someone who needs a New Morning in the middle of the day, or in the middle of a dark night. God knows, and so do we, there will always be folks who need a New Morning, a New Dawning, in their heart. In their soul. In their life.

As we begin another New Year, let's ask God to keep on making us His "real" Morning People. He Can. He will. All we must do is keep on hearing the words of His Son.

He said: "You are the light of the world! He also said: "Let your light shine!"

Job purpose

- To provide leadership of the clubhouse. This includes hiring and supervising clubhouse staff; ensuring food services and golfing activities are provided with excellence and in accordance with requirements of Alberta Health Services and AGLC; ensuring accurate administration of records are kept. Decisions must be made in compliance with Board policies.

Duties and responsibilities

- **Hire and Supervise Clubhouse Staff**
 - In conjunction with the Board, advertise for and interview potential staff for clubhouse.
 - Ensure staff are clear on expectations and system for handling disputes or complaints.
 - Ensure staff receive appropriate training to fulfill their responsibilities
 - Ensure staff are scheduled according to the needs of the clubhouse. Ensure schedules are fair and appropriate.
 - Able to fill shifts when staff call in sick
- **Provide Food Services**
 - Ensure supplies are purchased to facilitate the menu, Clubhouse snack and refreshments
 - Ensure building, kitchen, utensils and appliances are clean and maintained in accordance with Alberta Health and Safety codes for food preparation.
 - Communicate with golf tournament organizers, men's night and ladies' night organizers about specific menu needs for their respective days or nights and provide agreed upon menu and refreshment needs.
- **Administration**
 - Ensure guests can book rental carts, campsites, private events and course closures.
 - Provide communication about local and surrounding tournaments.
 - Ensure accurate financial records are kept for each day.
 - Ensure staff expense reports are maintained in a timely and accurate fashion
 - Update and maintain membership and shed rental lists.

Duties includes hiring and supervising course staff; ensuring the course is in excellent condition and ready for participants to use; ensuring equipment is maintained and plans are in place for replacement; ensuring the campground is maintained and ready for campers. Decisions must be made in compliance with Board policies.

Duties and responsibilities

- **Assist with Course Staff**
 - Ensure staff receive appropriate training to fulfill their responsibilities
 - Assist in personnel management and evaluation
 - Assist in employee safety protocols and procedures
 - Schedule work and supervise employees
- **Provide Course Maintenance**
 - Ensure supplies are purchased that are needed to maintain the turf and the course
 - Ensure seasonal scheduling is maintained such as aeration, winterization, etc.
 - Ensure equipment is maintained and staff are trained on safety and operation of each piece of equipment.
 - Ensure course is prepared for tournaments and special events
 - Assist in programming, repair and maintenance of irrigation systems
 - Performs or supervises the implementation of an overall turf health program
 - Spring snow removal and tarp removal
 - Maintaining an inventory of equipment
- **Provide Campground Maintenance**
 - Ensure campground is cleaned regularly
 - Ensure maintenance is provided to campground on an as needed basis
 - Ensure garbage containers are emptied and secured
 - Tree removal and bush trimming as required.

Qualifications

- Turf Management Diploma (preferred)
- Driver's license is an asset
- Experience with management of course and staff.
- Communication and conflict management skills.
- Operation of light and heavy equipment
- Irrigation system operation, repair and maintenance
- Ability to lead and work as part of a team.
- Possession of Pesticide Applicators Certificate or ability to obtain certification within 2 years
- Pre-Employment Drug and Alcohol test required

Working conditions

The Course Manager must have the ability to set and monitor their own hours to fit within the salary set by the Board. The Course is open seven days a week. Work hours are typically 5:30am to 2:00pm, however, weekends and evenings may be required depending on course demands.

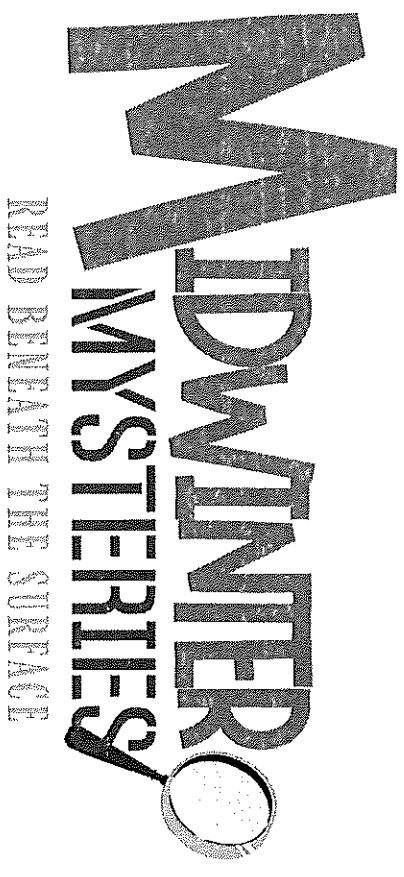
